In an effort to raise awareness of educational age management, the SOLARIS project organised a number of Multiplier Events in Partner countries, including the Czech Republic, Italy, Portugal, Romania, Spain, and Turkey.

These events provided an excellent opportunity for us to showcase the results and outputs we have been working on over the last two years. These include a collection of in-depth interviews with staff from across the education sector, a detailed training curriculum, and a practical training programme for school staff which aims to enhance their understanding of age-friendly practices and demonstrate their application in institutions.
